Thank you to everyone who participated in our online survey and weighed in on the impacts of a potential drop in water level on the Winnipeg River that may be necessary to accommodate future work at Slave Falls Generating Station. Some of the key insights from this survey will be shared with you in the coming weeks.

We are now developing a workplan based on our assessment of the concrete structures at Slave Falls and feedback collected from local residents, Indigenous communities, and waterway users in our initial outreach and survey this summer. We will provide an update on the workplan in spring 2021 as it will take time to develop.

A few local property owners have asked if they should bring their docks or boats in early this season to prepare for a potential drop in water level. The answer is no – if our workplan requires a drop in water level on the Winnipeg River between Slave Falls and Pointe du Bois Generating Stations, it will not happen this fall or winter.
