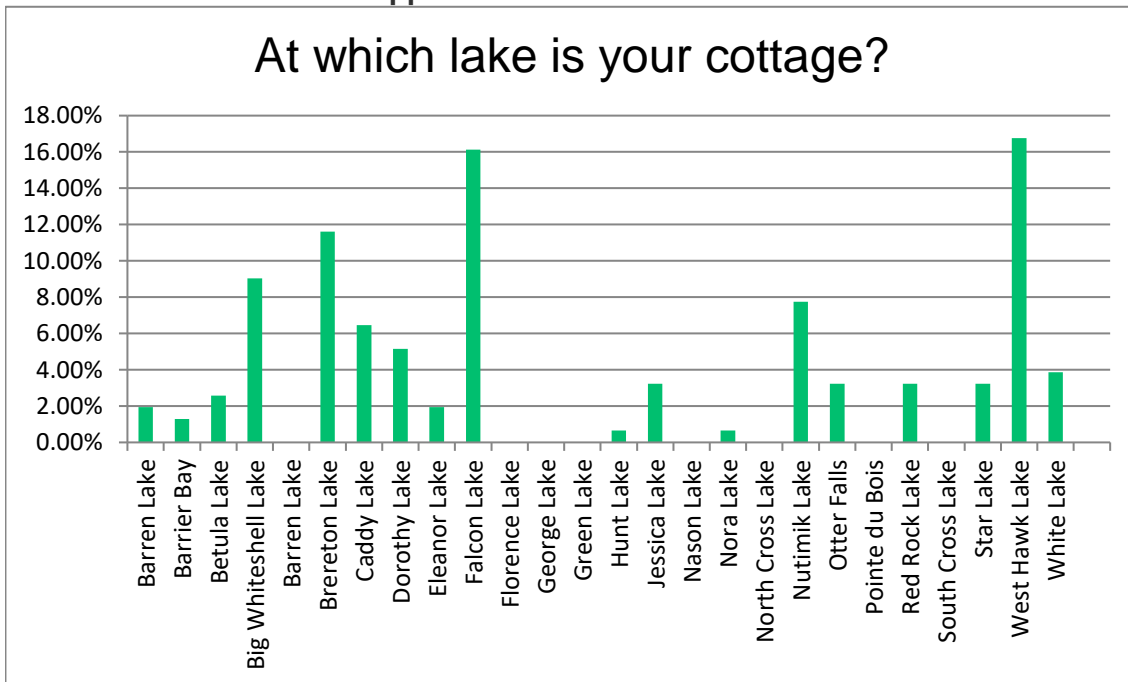

Cottagers were asked if they had any issues at their particular lake that they would like to see WCA involved in. Every lake expressed concerns over low water levels leading to problems such as weeds, algae, problems with boating and inaccessible boat launches.

The other common issues are identified below:

Barren Lake	RCMP were called out on many calls of lost hikers."maintenance of park trails" specifically markers
Barrier Bay	More lobbying for improved service especially in times when the park population is at its peak, reduced speed limits
Betula Lake	Water level control and water quality were identified as issues for all
Big Whiteshell Lake	Questions about North Whiteshell fire department, provincial RFP rumours about privatizing the Park
Brereton Lake	Winter road clearing, block road maintenance, drinking water, changes to waste depots, enforcement of building codes and parking on block roads
Caddy Lake	Road maintenance, dust abatement, weeds and algae affecting swimming conditions, boating safety, limiting commercial development and cottages being rented out.
Dorothy Lake	Enforcement of park passes, concerns about hunting, rental cottages
Eleanor Lake	None identified
Falcon Lake	Traffic enforcement, cottage based rental businesses, block road maintenance, rumours about privatizing the park, beach expansion and maintenance, reduce shoreline development
Hunt Lake	Highway 44 ,High Rock to the Hunt Lake Trail in need of repairs
Jessica Lake	charging cottagers fairly for services depending on area, changes to waste management
Nutimik Lake	Maintenance of the beach area and sand, pothole repair and maintenance of highway 307
Otter Falls	No 911 service in north Whiteshell.
Red Rock Lake	Too much boat traffic
Star Lake	Poor beach conditions, weeds
West Hawk Lake	Noise pollution, enforcement of deadfall removal for lease renewals, enforcement of park passes, upgrades to waste management, traffic congestion and speed control, control over cottage development that alters the natural environment, privatization of leased land
White Lake	Hwy 307 conditions, traffic on block 3 road to Rainbow Falls, changes to waste management, beach playground
